Hear from Olga Garay-English, Director of the Latinx Theatre Initiative (NLTI), and learn how the NLTI regranted \$8.6 million in two years to over 60 Latinx theatre groups in the United States. Along with Jose Luis Valenzuela of the Latino Theater Company, they saw a problem, created an alliance, and began financially stabilizing Latinx theatres across the nation. This case study will inspire you to think big in creating initiatives that support your field and communities!

Working with the Biggest Business in your City—Local Government

Social Storytelling

How do you build a social media presence for your artistic practice? This workshop led by Houston-based content creator @Dr_Boffone (Dr. Trevor Boffone) will challenge us to push through the writer's block and create short videos in teams, while also getting a glimpse of each other's processes.

Complex collaborations often involve partners across sectors, disciplines, and extend beyond 2-3 partners. We'll learn about a few examples and use our learnings to co-create a manifesto for complex collaborations for all symposium attendees.
